Oscar Roberts Neighborhood Reconstruction

Dear Resident,

Concrete crews will complete all curb and gutter and concrete flatwork by the end of this week.

Grading crews are currently working on getting everyone back in their driveways. They will build a gravel ramp by the curb and gutter to allow you access back into your driveway.

If you have an asphalt or paver driveway, crews will soon be on site to replace the portions that were removed or disturbed during the construction process. At this time, crews do not have an exact schedule for this work, but I would assume it would take place soon.

Early next week grading crews will begin to shape the roadways for paving. Again, it will be a moving process; once they have passed your driveway, crews will backfill a small gravel ramp for access your driveway.

Please do not park any vehicles on the roadway. The streets will be accessible during the grading tolerance work; however the contractor will need to use the full street for the grading process. You may encounter certain periods when access to your driveway may be limited. Feel free to ask for help from the crew onsite if you need special assistance. It will take approximately 3 days to complete the grading and shaping portion of the project.

Crews plan on paving your street late next week. The roadway will be open to traffic while they pave, and it is safe to drive on it. Crews will direct you where to drive, etc. as the paving process proceeds. While they are paving there will be no parking allowed on your street. This will help to facilitate the trucking and paving process and speed up the operation.

Once the paving phase is completed, crews will then begin the restoration phase of the project. This will include landscaping, irrigation, pet fence, and sod restoration.

Safety

Please remind your children to stay away from construction sites, construction machinery, and stockpiled materials. These sites, machines, and materials can be dangerous. Job site safety is our number one concern.

Who to Contact in an Emergency

During a life or property-threatening emergency, call 911. If construction equipment or materials need to be moved as part of dealing with the emergency, 911 have a list of the

contractor's emergency contacts. If it is not an emergency, you can also get a hold of the Edina Police Dept. on their non-emergency phone number at 952-826-1600.
